

### Morning.

Oil share is giving back some ground this morning while soybeans were near unchanged as of 6:30 from the slowdown in deteriorating US crop conditions. SBO deliveries were 453 where CHS stopped 325, Bunge stopped 127, and customer JP issued 453. Bunge cancelled 34 meal receipts. Malaysian palm oil fell 57 MYR and cash was down \$15.00/ton. China's soybean futures complex was lower. Offshore values were leading CBOT sharply lower by 88 points and meal \$0.80 lower. USD was up 7 points earlier and WTI crude oil up nearly \$0.70. China booked 13.53 million tons of U.S. soybeans through Aug. 27, for delivery in 2020-21, which started Sept. 1. Another 1.1 million tons have been booked since then. Overnight we heard they bought 9-11 cargoes (private and state) on Tuesday. CBOT corn and wheat are lower. Thailand bought 25,000 tons of feed barley. Japan received no offers for feed wheat. Apparently, President Trump directed the EPA to deny dozens of refiner requests for retroactive waivers from concerns the issue was costing him politically, according to three sources via a Reuters article. RIN prices are expected to trade higher today.

#### Corn.

- CBOT corn was lower before the electronic pause on as expected US crop ratings and wet weather for the Midwest.
- Apparently, President Trump directed the EPA to deny dozens of refiner requests for retroactive waivers from concerns the issue was costing him politically, according to three sources via a Reuters article. E20 RINs were up to 55 vs. 47 yesterday.
- US corn crop conditions dropped one point. The trade was looking for a two-point drop.
- China cash corn prices bias northeastern region increased by nearly 30 percent from the start of the year to 2,355 yuan (HK\$2,661) per ton at the beginning of August, before falling slightly to 2,274 yuan per ton at month's end, according to the National Bureau of Statistics data via Reuters article. Heavy flooding from three typhoons have supported prices and likely lowered production.
- Europe will see restricted rainfall this week and temperatures will be above normal.

- USDA US corn export inspections as of September 03, 2020 were 781,838 tons, within a range of trade expectations, above 423,765 tons previous week and compares to 612,065 tons year ago. Major countries included Mexico for 216,657 tons, China Main for 204,407 tons, and Japan for 165,826 tons.
- BB AstraZeneca Plc stopped giving shots of its experimental coronavirus vaccine after a person participating in one of the company's studies got sick, a potential adverse reaction that could delay or derail efforts to speed an immunization against Covid-19.

#### Soybean complex.

- CBOT November soybeans were slightly higher on Chinese demand but a smaller than expected decline in US crop ratings are limiting gains.
- Soybean conditions for the combined good and excellent categories fell one point, as expected.
- ICE canola was very firm yesterday. November canola was up \$7.20 to \$510.90 per ton and during the Tuesday session. It rose as high as \$514.90, highest price since June 2018.
- Ukraine sunflower oil prices are up by \$70-\$90/ton so far in Sep to \$945-\$950 per ton, according to APK-Inform. During August they climbed \$45-\$55 per ton. Higher demand and expected 8.5 percent decrease in production to 14.00 MMT from 15.3 MMT have underpinned prices. Oil World is at 15.8 million tons for Ukraine. China has been a good buyer of sunflower oil recently. Oil World noted Northwest Europe sunflower prices are at a 5-year high, and now above cash rapeseed oil.
- Offshore values this morning were leading CBOT soybean oil 88 lower and meal \$0.80 lower.
- Rotterdam soybean oil values were about 7 euros lower, rapeseed oil 6 lower in the benchmark positions, and Rotterdam meal mostly 2-6 euros lower from this time previous session.
- We heard China bought 9-11 cargoes of US soybeans on Tuesday.
- China cash crush margins as of this morning, using our calculation, were 88 cents per bushel (98 previous) and compares to 80 cents a week ago and 77 cents around this time last year.

- USDA US soybean export inspections as of September 03, 2020 were 1,295,462 tons, above a range of trade expectations, above 808,656 tons previous week and compares to 977,914 tons year ago. Major countries included China Main for 827,612 tons, Mexico for 59,977 tons, and Bangladesh for 52,856 tons.
- A Reuters poll calls for Malaysia's palm oil end of August stocks to increase 5.4 percent from the previous month to 1.79 million tons. Production is expected increase 2% to 1.84 million tons. The Malaysian Palm Oil Board will release the official data on Sept. 10.

#### Oilseeds Export Developments

• Results awaited: Algeria seeks up to 30,000 tons of soybean meal on September 9 for first half October shipment.

#### Wheat

- Wheat is trading lower to mixed for the 5<sup>th</sup> day on lack of US export interest and improving North American weather ahead of winter sowing season.
- US harvest progress for the spring wheat crop came in at 82 percent, one point below expectations, and winter wheat plantings was 5 percent, one point above expectations.
- India monsoon rains were 30 percent below average for the week ending September 9.
- Paris December wheat was down 0.25 at 188.50 euros.
- Russian wheat exports were 15.0 million tons in the first seven months of 2020 from 13.6 million tons a year ago, according to official customs.
- Ukraine shipped about 203,000 tons of wheat to Pakistan in August, noted UkrAgroConsult. That's the first shipment since 2014, according to UN trade data (Bloomberg).
- Kazakhstan was 70 percent harvested as of Sep 9 from 11.1 million hectares, well up from 35 percent at this time last year. 17.9MMT of grain will be produced this year-AgMin.
- EU wheat exports are down 44 percent (July-Sep. 6) to 2.94 million tons.
- Keep an eye on frost/freeze events for the unharvested spring wheat crops across Canada and the US.

- USDA US all-wheat export inspections as of September 03, 2020 were 695,741 tons, within a range of trade expectations, above 534,135 tons previous week and compares to 413,606 tons year ago. Major countries included Vietnam for 96,795 tons, China Main for 90,106 tons, and Mexico for 63,063 tons.
- Egypt will set up a commodities exchange for wheat, rice, and vegetable oils beginning FH 2021.
